Saint Isaac Jogues Youth Conference (for high school youth) Friday, July 10-12, 2016

SIJYC is the premier Catholic Youth Conference in the Northeast. It is hosted by the Diocese of Albany and St. Ambrose Church. The weekend includes awesome speakers who share their own faith journey to teach, encourage and inspire. Teens experience the Sacraments throughout the weekend, and learn the richness of the Catholic Faith through workshops, daily mass, group discussions, games, skits, great live music, fun, food, and free time! The cost for the SIJYC is \$120. Teens and chaperones stay at the Holiday Inn Express on Columbia Turnpike and Old Loudon Road for an additional \$140, but rooms accommodate up to 6 people so it is split.

Faith at Our Lady of the Assumption

We all look forward to relaxation this summer, but that does not mean that the joy of the Gospel and growing in faith should stop.

Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (John 8:12).

This verse tells us that we should embrace the summer light. This means not only simply embracing more sunlight, but more Sonlight. We have a little bit more time to relax, so why not think of ways to use this tremendous light? Why not soak up the Son by taking 15-20 minutes to read Scripture? We could make it one of our goals to go through one of the Gospels.

Mark's Gospel emphasizes ministry and evangelization, so this Gospel could motivate us to use some of our time for charity and love of neighbor.

Matthew's Gospel emphasizes Old Testament fulfillments and the family of God. So this Gospel can remind us that family should never get old, but always be made anew by being rooted in one another and growing towards God.

Luke's Gospel emphasizes what it means to be the perfect person since he traces Jesus' genealogy back to Adam, the son of God (Luke 3:38). For example, Luke shows us through Jesus, that being a perfect person means to be filled with God's love (the Holy Spirit), to embrace God's mercy (see the mercy parables of Luke 15), and always to take time to pray. So from this Gospel, we could be prompted to use some of the "extra time" we now have to pray a Rosary or the Lord's Prayer.

John's Gospel starts with the divine and embraces the humanity of Christ. With this Gospel we could challenge ourselves to pray for the gift of wisdom to slow life down and think about how God is trying to speak to us through the ordinary things in life.

We must challenge ourselves to be a light to future generations by continuing to love, embracing the good news in the Gospels, and taking in as much Sonlight as possible.

Big Changes in the Elementary Faith Formation Program
