Hello OLA Parishioners,

I pray this letter finds you well and safe. I want to introduce myself, my name is Loretta Brzac and I am the Prayer and Worship Committee Chairperson for Parish Council here at Our Lady of the Assumption. We have seen many parishioners return to Mass as we've adjusted to all that the Covid pandemic has thrown at us all. Even as Covid regulations/recommendations seem to change fluidly still, we have adapted and tried to make a safe environment for worship. Yes, we continue to wear masks, this allows us to protect the youngest of our parish family who cannot yet receive the Covid vaccine, as well as our parish members who have a few more health concerns. We also are asking everyone to hand sanitize on the way into church to keep as many germs out of church as possible (the flu and RSV are still active too.)

I have been acting as greeter and hand sanitizer for the Saturday 4:30 p.m. Mass since we returned to in person Mass and I have had the privilege to see many familiar faces return to Mass. I have also had the pleasure of meeting and getting to know many people that I may not have ever gotten to know if the Covid pandemic never happened. I have to admit, before the pandemic, I came into church, found my seat, listened to Mass and served as Eucharistic Minister if I was scheduled. I didn't really talk to many people if I didn't already know them. I would have said it's because I'm shy, or that I didn't think anyone really wanted to talk to me so I was better off keeping to myself. HOW WRONG I WAS!!! I have learned a great deal about the COMMUNITY of the Church during this Covid pandemic. I realize now that I was robbing people of the chance of connecting with others while we were all there gathered to celebrate the most beautiful gift lesus has given us, the Eucharist!

During the last 2 years we have advanced our technology at OLA and we can now stream Mass at a time that fits into our lives, when we may have missed Mass entirely in the past or it's iust more convenient. I too watched Mass online before the 4:30 mass opened back up. That was MY Mass and how could I possibly go to a different Mass time??? Well I still go to the 4:30 Mass, but every week I see people that come in that "normally" go to the 7:30 or the 9 a.m. Sunday Masses! Wait, we can do that?!?! (Of course, I knew I could, but we become such creatures of habit!) Seeing the faces of these people helps make the Church community feel larger, something MORE than my small self. I Corinthians 12:12 reads: "For even as the body is one and yet has many members, and all the members of the body, though they are many, are one body, so also is Christ." Our own bodies are made up of many parts hands, feet, eyes, ears - and if any of them were missing we would miss that part dearly as

each part is important and has a purpose. The same holds true for our Parish Community. We FEEL the missing parishioners from Mass. We miss the faces being in church, but more, we miss the SPIRIT that is brought in by each and every one of US! Without all of the parts of our church, we are missing out on being WHOLE. Since we've been back in church, have we been "managing" without having everyone back? Yes we have, thanks to a few very dedicated volunteers and faith-filled parishioners, but we would LOVE to have more members of our community return to Mass. We Miss YOU!

It is understandable if you're still cautious about being back in person if you are an at-risk individual. If so, please continue (or start - that's good also) to follow us on YouTube and watch the streaming Masses (Saturday Vigil and Wednesday Daily Mass.) We still want to connect with you in any way that we can. If you would like a phone call from one of the Parish Council members or to receive an "old fashioned" letter (I love to write those!) to reconnect with the community, call the Parish Office and we will reach out and connect.

For everyone else, please think about (or even PRAY about) returning to Mass as we get ready to start the season of Lent. This is the PERFECT time for the flock of Jesus to return HOME.
